



Apartment displayed this sign...perfect for Megan who is in a wheelchair after a diving accident a year ago left her paralyzed with only some arm movement. She is 22, and this is her first apartment.



Here was the door before ...only had a deadbolt lock on it, which she had a hard time reaching from her wheelchair, & even harder time inserting the key and turning it!



Here is the Amesbury LoCCA ACCESS product installed...just an electronic strike in the door jamb, wired into the control box, plugged into the nearest outlet.....gives the person wireless, keyless, remote control access to their home!



Here is the door after...we gave her a new latch plus deadbolt locking handle-2 locking points now for added security. The handle was purchased at the local hardware store...(note: the Amesbury LoCCA Access will work with most latch lock entry door handles)! The deadbolt lock is an added benefit since the door already had a hole for the deadbolt lock. Megan, who is coming home from the hospital to her first apartment, will be able to get in easily and on her own! Her benevolent Aunt Sue demonstrates, pushing the remote and pushing the door...no keys, no handle cranking...**just push!**
